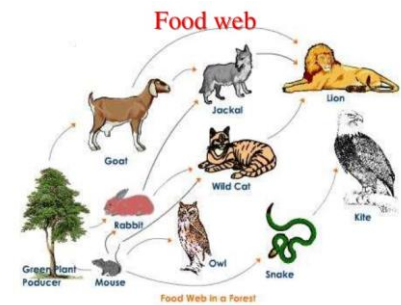
What's happening in Year 3?

Dear Parents and Carers,

In Year 3, the learning, laughing and loving continues! After a successful spring term, we are really proud to say that the children are continuing to make good progress. They loved their recent theme all about the Circus, especially when they got to create their very own circus story about an exciting trapeze performance. We are looking forward to continuing to work with you this term to move your child's progress forward as much as possible before the summer holidays.

Our theme will also link closely to our new science topic which is all about food chains and ecosystems. Your child will be learning how to classify animals by their diet and sorting them into food chains.



PE

In PE we are starting gymnastics lessons and are learning all about different jumps and footwork. As our skills progress, we will be learning different routines.

Our PE lessons are on Thursday or Friday, so don't forget to wear your PE kit to school on that day. This should be a pair of trainers, grey or black track suit bottoms, white t-shirt and a jumper or hoodie.

THEME!

Our current Theme is: *Would you like to go on Safari?*



This half term your child is going to be learning all about African animals and their adaptations. We will be starting this theme with a day of planning for our writing this half term. The children will be making safari hats and binoculars in readiness for a school trip to Yorkshire Wildlife Park. This real-life experience will help our child to learn all about the features, habitats and adaptations of African animals, how they are endangered in their natural environments and how conservationists are helping with their survival, which they will use to extend their learning.

We will also be using the knowledge we gain to help with our writing, which this half term is all about persuasion. We are going to learn what it means to persuade people. We will be exploring the language features of this text type and using our knowledge to write a persuasive text all about adopting an African animal.



Learning at Home

Each week the children are expected to read at home at least once a week and practice their times tables. You can also access learning on MyMaths, Purple Mash and Times Tables Rockstar if you want to try other activities.
